

Strategic Plan 2021-2025

BACKGROUND:

European College of Law and Business (ECLB) has been established to support students to be able to achieve globally recognised degree at an affordable cost, with the commitment to providing quality education in an integrated, scholarly and vibrant learning environment. With this view, the College obtained accreditation from Matrix Standards for its Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG).

The College currently provides Level 3 education to the UK and EU nationals to support the government's strategy of providing funds to enable people do their jobs better, get new jobs, or progress in their careers.

The College is currently located in Mansfield, Nottingham, where it occupies a self-contained floor of a multi-occupancy building. This facility includes a library, offices, IT lab, Library and classrooms. The College currently has three full-time and three part-time members of staff.

ECLB is proud of being a thriving and successful learning provider in Mansfield. It has continued to adapt successfully to the needs of students by investing in adequate facilities for teaching, learning, welfare and IAG service.

We are innovative, hardworking and objective driven with a commitment to adding value to employers and enterprise. At ECLB, students can maximise their chances of securing a career by developing both knowledge and skills.

Our vision is to ensure students' career progression through education, qualification, employment and entrepreneurship. The mission statement of the College is 'to bridge the gap between industry and the academic world through quality education'. The ECLB strapline "we shape your education, you shape your life" - is the key message to our potential students.

The last cohort of 19 students successfully completed the BTEC qualification in Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma in Business in February 2020 (100% pass rate). This was a government funded project ran in partnership with New London Educational Trust (NLET).

ECLB aims to run OTHM qualifications in the recent future and have the plan to obtain Centre approval from Pearson, ATHE and NCFE to offer Level 3 to Level 7 qualifications. To maximise the use of the premise we need to increase the number of students and expedite growth. With this effect we planned to relocate the ECLB from Mansfield to London in October 2020, however because of the Covid-19 it has been delayed. We have therefore rescheduled it for March 2021.

Our main objectives are to

- provide high quality further education of a quality that learners can cherish
- enhance their employability and entrepreneurial skills
- add value to their current qualifications, skills and experiences
- increase motivation, self-esteem and life chances
- improve our services through continuous monitoring and reviewing

PHYSICAL RESOURCES

We provide learning opportunities for adults over 18 years of age. The College possesses a strong dedication to equality, diversity and equal opportunities.

The College has a capacity of 2500 sq foot of floor area accommodating 70 students at any one time making a total of 210 students organised into multiple cohorts. It is to be said that we are currently lot less than our threshold. We have five classrooms including one computer lab and a Library with 16 computer terminals, internet and Wi Fi connectivity throughout the College premise.


ECLB has a library which is reasonably stocked with up to date resources allowing students the opportunity to study in a relaxed atmosphere. As part of the enhancement of learning opportunities, the College will keep adding to its library stock as required.

Committee structure

The Committee is responsible for setting the key performance indicators (KPI) for each course and the delivery and conduct of all course assessments to ensure that the KPI's are met.

Our students both potential and existing are the focal point of our learning provision at ECLB. The diagram below explains how our students benefit from the services around them. Our students are our focal point and will remain so.




Fig. Enhancement Diagram

This blended learning approach will also help us in delivering online classes where the learners will be able to join their lesions from home when face to face sessions may not be feasible.

Advice and Guidance

ECLB always treats its students with utmost priority and advises them on the best possible academic route to their desired professional career. ECLB students are guided by qualified tutors to the duration of their study. The staff responsible for student welfare assists students Page 6 of 7

with any academic issues and offers counselling sessions for any pastoral support that is required. The Principal is available for a discussion relating to any academic or non-academic issues that might have an impact while they are studying at ECLB. All staff members are fully trained and are aware of the students need, where appropriate.

Our Public Information is accurate and up-to-date. The Information Advice and Guidance (IAG) we provide to our students is professional and quality assured. Students' feedback suggests that the IAG service provided to our students/clients has helped them in boosting their confidence, self-esteem, motivation and aspiration.

Making the Difference - Study Support, a deliberate step to enhancement

ECLB provides One to One tuitions to its students as required/requested. The College also runs revision sessions to provide students with extra tuition on specific modules in refreshing their memories and study skills. Report writing and research skills are areas covered in these sessions. Students find them of immense value as it gives them the opportunity to explore the diversity of approaches in their subject areas and make progress without any unexpected pressure. We send our students to organisations dedicated to provide training on CV writing and mock interview sessions. We also engage students with external links of various job show and job related conferences and seminars.
